
THE CARL SILVERMAN ENDOWMENT FUND

He thrived in a place with small class sizes, individual lesson plans and a social environment where everyone, teachers and students, cared about and respected each other. His teachers and all staff were dedicated professionals who established deep and lasting relationships with all their students.

The life skills he acquired at Dunblaine served him well after he graduated. He acquired the tools that enabled him to thrive in every community he joined since his graduation.

The tuition at the school is expensive. This is inevitable when you are running an institution with a small number of students and a large ratio of staff to children.

In Carl's memory, I am setting up an endowment to assist other parents with limited means to send their children into an environment where they can learn and thrive. Carl is sorely missed by his family and friends.
